Things we know to be true: At the end of the day or the end of a lifetime, it is the people (and fur babies) that will matter the most. My favorite Thanksgiving celebrations as a child would involve a long car ride south to visit my mom's family in Kentucky. I have significant feelings of being cared forthrough hugs and food and endless conversations. One of my early discoveries in this congregation was that Pauline Greear grew up not far from where I would visit. Her accent and mannerisms take me back to time with my aunts. I long to hear her stories.



In October, we featured Al Stoner in our worship service. He shared some of his memories of working in the church. In future months, there are plans to interview other long-term leaders. Along with our many photo albums, these videos will hopefully keep us grounded in the best of memories and purpose. I give thanks for the stories I have heard and for those that are before us.

At Administrative Council and Charge Conference, we will have the opportunity to share both our accomplishments of the past few years and our dreams as we move forward. I find myself repeating a small awareness from the October lectionary readings. There were two healings of blind men. In the first story, the blind man was a member of the community, and the disciples knew they had a responsibility to share Jesus with him. In the story of Bartimaeus, the blind man was separated from community. He was on the side of the road, begging to be noticed. The disciples wanted to ignore and quiet him. Jesus spoke to the community and ordered them to bring Bartimaeus before him. In the days that followed, I have spoken with church members who find homes among those who are "crying out". I have invited them to join our leadership for this next season and I look forward to the experience they will offer us.

On Wednesday evenings (beginning November 10 at 7 pm), we will share one of Adam Hamilton's early studies – The Journey. We will explore the places and stories of Joseph, Mary, Elizabeth, as well as the shepherds and the angels. We will join this journey with our own questions and with new members. Together we will expect to see God's love manifest in our conversations and our community.

Thank you to those who have reached out with special words of welcome. Your thoughts are much appreciated. Hopefully I am getting better with names and stories – I hope I will have many years to sort it all out with you.

We are looking for a Children's Ministry Assistant.

The official position posting is as follows:

At Ridgefield United Methodist, we greet ALL as God's children. The same greeting is put forth in staffing. We welcome all ethnicity, sexual orientations and ages.

Someone to work Sunday mornings under the direction of our Children's Ministry Leader. This person will float between age groups of nursery up to high school students as needed. It's a great opportunity for experience if you are schooling to go into the childcare/teaching fields. We would love to have someone in this like minded area. This is a Church position, you will need to be open to the teachings of the Bible.

Job Responsibilities:

- Provide excellent care for children, birth through teens, on Sunday mornings.
- Maintain a clean and safe environment in our Church Nursery/Kids Rooms.
- Help to maintain check-in and check-out system to ensure children's safety.
- Will be open to additional hours as needs arise, i.e. for occasional meetings.

Qualifications:

- Experience working with children and helping to create an environment where they feel welcome, wanted and safe.
- Background Checks will be administered as well as needing to be CPR certified. You must also uphold RCUMC's Safe Sanctuaries policy. (Copies of the policy will be made available to the caregiver and kept onsite for access.)
- This position requires that you communicate well with the Children's Ministry Director, Pastor, and Parents.
- We also ask that you will appreciate the Church environment and understand that your attitude will shape how young children understand church.
- Must be 18 years or older.
- Masks will be required, indoor or outside for as long as Covid persists.

Employment Specifics:

- Hours are 9:30am to 11:30am every Sunday.
- Compensation is \$17/hour.
- Children's Ministry Assistant will be willing to provide childcare during additional evening meetings, as his/her/their schedule allows. (infrequent)
